Additional Information

- Market Goats should be born between January and March.
- Cost of goat can vary.
- Market goats can be wethers or does.
- Does cannot be both breeding and market.
- ➤ Goats eat about 2.5-3.5% of their body weight in feed a day
- > Goats need room for exercise and play
- Shelter from the elements and predators.
- > Clean straw or shavings for bedding.
- Goats must have a permanent scrapie identification.
