English

English Saddle, saddle pad, English bridle, helmet, English boots, breeches, show shirt and show jacket.

Showmanship/In Hand

No Chaps/spurs, western hat or ASTM approved helmet, long sleeve button down shirt, long pants, boots, show halter (not nylon) and lead (chain optional).
