

# Stop and Call our office if .....

- You cannot find your family profile. **DO NOT** create a new one.
- You want to change clubs in 2022
- You are a new member or volunteer
- You do not have access to the internet

New families should call our office **before** enrolling online. We will go over the process with them.

By allowing you access, you can update your club and project information as well as personal information (email, home address, phone, etc). This will ensure that you are properly enrolled in the county program and receive important news and updated such as newsletters, deadline information, and leadership opportunities. **Projects cannot be changed/added after the April 1 enrollment deadline.** 

If your child(ren) belongs to a shared parenting household, you will need to decide a primary address for all materials that are to be mailed.

The ability to change or update your information may be limited in certain fields of 4-H Online 2.0. If you see information that is incorrect and you are not able to make changes, please call the Extension office for the changes to be made.

OSU Extension, Hocking County will be hosting a county-wide 4-H Cloverbud Club beginning January 5, 2022. All youth, age 5 and in Kindergarten through age 8 and in second grade as of January 1, are eligible to participate. The club will meet from 6:30-7:30 pm in the Youth Center on January 5 and 19, February 2 and 16, March 2 and 16.



There is no cost to join. Meetings will include informal lessons, recreation, and snacks. Youth will be required to return a completed 4-H enrollment form and attend a minimum of four meetings to be complete. #### **Beef DNA/EID Kits**



The Ohio State Fair requires all market beef entered in the 2022 Ohio State Fair to have individual DNA samples taken from each animal that may potentially be entered. **These DNA samples must be in the possession of the Ohio State Fair by January 15, 2022.** Kits may be picked up at the Extension Office. If you need a kit, please contact us at 740-385-3222.

#### **Mandatory – Animal Quality Assurance Training**

All 4-H and FFA members enrolled in the following projects: beef, swine, sheep, goat, llama/alpaca, rabbit, and poultry are required to attend one Quality Assurance class before the May 27, 2022, deadline. This includes <u>all projects</u> in these species. All classes will be held at the Youth Center and **RSVP is required**. Class dates are:

Wednesday, March 9, 6-8 PM Thursday, April 14, 6-8 PM

Saturday, **April 30**, 9-11 AM Monday, **May 23**, 6-8 PM *There is a \$20 fee for this class*.

Because of limited seating, preregistration will be required. Classes are free to Hocking County youth, except for the May 23 class. There is a \$20 fee for this class. Cash, check, or money orders are accepted; we are not able to accept debit and credit cards.

Older youth test-out and the online YQCA option are available this year also. All YQCA and out-of-county certificates are due to the Extension Office by 4 pm, May 27.
