To reserve a fair booth for your club in the Youth Center, this form must be submitted to the Extension Office by **August 21, 2026**.

Clubs may choose their own theme in 2026.

Booths are limited so don't delay.

Those who reserve a booth and fail to set-up or tear down the booth during designated hours will not be permitted to reserve a booth the following year.

Please note:

- In order to receive a fair premium for a still/special-interest project, members must submit an **educational display** for each project.
- Members enrolled in companion animal (dog, cat, cavy, pocket pets, ferret, reptile, etc) and livestock projects will only receive a premium if project animal(s) is shown in a live show at the fair. Exceptions are All About Dogs, Horseless Horse, and Beginning Horse Management* since these projects do not require a project animal.
 - ▶ *Beg Horse Mngmt – This only applies to members that have not ID a project animal.
 - ▶ The Fair offers live classes for Dog, Cat, Pocket Pet (Mice, Rat, Hamster, Gerbil ONLY), Cavy (Guinea Pig). All other small animals (ferret, reptile, etc) must be entered in the Other Small Animal Class.

What defines an educational display?

- A poster highlighting what the member learned in regard to the project
- A display or poster with labels identifying the parts of something related to the project

A non-exhaustive list of examples of member displays that will **NOT** receive fair premiums include:

- Project books
- Photos of members
- Lists of members' names
- Member trophies/ribbons

These items may be included in the booth. However, to receive a fair premium, each member's project display must be educational.
